- This is one of the three policies that all full Institutional Members should have Acquisition, Preservation, and Access Policies and should be reviewed or updated at least every 5 years as part of the **review process for Institutional Members** (see full details here). - We also want to update the (horribly out-of-date) page of our website, which lists the <u>acquisition policies of all Institutional Members of the CNSA</u>. In keeping with our Cooperative Acquisition Strategy, making these policies available can help **direct researchers and potential donors to the most appropriate archive(s) in the province**. NEW: Disaster Preparedness & Recovery resources for members!

Coming soon! The new **Disaster Recovery Kit for Archival & Heritage Collections** (AKA: The Aftermath Kit) will contain supplies to help you salvage your collections and remedy damage to them caused by water, dirt, smoke, mould, and/or pests following an emergency. Any member institution can borrow the entire Kit or parts thereof. The Kit isn't yet complete, but in the meantime, you can find out more about its proposed contents and read the draft loan agreement on our new webpage on Disaster Preparedness and Recovery (link below).

The page also includes info about how to <u>restock your Disaster Kit</u> from Canadian Tire (or build one from scratch); <u>how-to videos</u> on handling and packing wet records as well as removing mould, dirt, etc; plus oodles of <u>resources on salvaging and remedying damage to archival collections</u>.

Hands-On Conference Workshop: Introduction to Disaster Recovery for Archival Materials


